

SONGWE POINT VILLAGE *of* Zambia



On a breathtaking site overlooking the Zambezi gorge and surrounded by vast areas of protected World Heritage land, lies Songwe Village. The accommodation has been purposely built in order to give visitors a unique 24 hour opportunity to experience the life and culture of an African village and its surrounding environment. Accommodation is in eight rustic thatched huts that have been designed to give guests the closest village experience possible, yet combined with a high level of comfort. Each hut has its own toilet and washbasin and there are four shower huts, two of which have an open fronted bath which is perched right on the edge of the gorge overlooking the Zambezi River. At twilight, guests meet at the central ntantaala (boma or reeded enclosure) for dinner, which is prepared over an open fire in traditional pots and served on enamel dishes as they listen to legends from a bygone age.

Activities

- Activities focus on cultural interaction

Wildlife

- Rich birdlife, hippo and crocodile in the river, and impala, elephants, bushbuck, etc. along the river bank
- Near Livingstone there is a small national park (Mosi-oa-Tunya) with white rhino, giraffe, impala, waterbuck, zebra, wildebeest etc. (no cats)
