DAY 1 ~ SUNDAY~ SEPTEMBER 13

BOZEMAN, MONTANA

Your journey begins upon your arrival at Bozeman Airport, where you will be met by your Classic Escapes Representative and transferred to your hotel, The C'mon Inn.

Bozeman is a hub for outdoor activities, horseback riding, historic wagon riding, kayaking, canoeing, fishing, biking and whitewater rafting, and in the winter skiing, dog sledding, and snowboarding. For thousands of years the Shoshone, Nez Perce, Blackfeet, Flathead, Crow Nation and Sioux Native American tribes have hunted and traveled through the area of Bozeman and pioneer settlers William Clark and Meriwether Lewis, sent by President Thomas Jefferson, visited the area in 1806, camping just a few stone-throws east of the town.

C'Mon Inn offers a warm and welcoming atmosphere that immediately creates a sense of tranquility and relaxation. The property features 125 well-appointed guest rooms, each designed for comfort with spacious layouts, modern furnishings, and private bathrooms with walk-in showers and complimentary toiletries. DAY 2~ MONDAY~ SEPTEMBER 14

YELLOWSTONE NATIONAL PARK: NORRIS GEYSER BASIN/GRAND PRISMATIC/Old FAITHFUL

you'll set out on a scenic drive to Yellowstone, Montana, making your first stop at Norris Geyser Basin, one of Yellowstone's most fascinating and active geothermal areas. The basin is home to some of the hottest and most acidic thermal features in the park, creating a dramatic landscape of steaming vents, bubbling hot springs, and colorful mineral deposits. As you explore the network of boardwalks and trails, you may encounter geysers erupting, fumaroles releasing plumes of steam, and mud pots



bubbling energetically. The ever-changing activity here offers a vivid reminder of Yellowstone's geothermal power and the dynamic forces at work beneath the surface.

Midday, pause for a picnic lunch surrounded by the park's serene landscapes, a perfect opportunity to relax and enjoy the fresh mountain air.



Continue to the Grand Prismatic Spring, Yellowstone's largest and most colorful hot spring. Walk along the boardwalks to admire the vivid bands of orange, red, and blue caused by mineral deposits and microbial life, capturing one of the park's most iconic geothermal features.

The day concludes with a visit to Old Faithful, the park's world-famous geyser. Observe the predictable eruption and explore the surrounding Upper Geyser Basin, which is dotted with steaming vents, bubbling pools, and smaller geysers, offering a fascinating glimpse into Yellowstone's geothermal activity.

Yellowstone West Gate Hotel is a welcoming, seasonal lodge-style hotel conveniently located less than a mile from the Grizzly & Wolf Discovery Center and within a 15-minute walk of the Yellowstone Historic Center. DAY 3 ~TUESDAY~ SEPTEMBER 15
YELLOWSTONE NATIONAL PARK: GRAND CANYON
OF YELLOWSTONE/ ARTIST POINT/ LOWER & UPPER
FALLS

Re-enter the park and proceed to the Grand Canyon of the Yellowstone, roughly 20 miles long, 1,000 feet deep and 2,500 feet wide and a relatively young formation at only 10,000 years old. Splashed with deep reds, oranges, and coppers due to its high content of Rhyolite, a hard, somewhat volcanic rock, it has inspired many artists throughout the years. Scour the numerous cliffs for movement or enormous five-foot nests of twigs and branches; if lucky you may spot an osprey or hear the whistling sound it makes while hunting echoing off the canyon walls. Meadows along your drive make for common sightings of elk, moose, and bison. Explore various outlooks of the Grand Canyon of Yellowstone.



After exploring the Grand Canyon of Yellowstone, continue your journey to Artist Point, one of the park's most celebrated viewpoints. From here, enjoy sweeping vistas of the canyon's colorful cliffs and the winding Yellowstone River below – a perfect spot to pause and capture the dramatic scenery.

Next, visit Upper Falls, where the river plunges into the canyon with a powerful roar. Walk along the trails and overlook platforms to experience different perspectives of the falls, feeling the mist and energy of the cascading water.

Continue to Lower Falls, the park's tallest waterfall, where the Yellowstone River thunders into the canyon below. Take in the scale and beauty of the falls from the various viewing areas, observing the striking contrast of the rushing water against the rugged canyon walls. Keep an eye out for wildlife along the way, as eagles, deer, and other creatures are often spotted in this area. This portion of the day highlights some of Yellowstone's most dramatic landscapes, combining awe-inspiring views, scenic walks, and close encounters with the park's natural wonders.



After enjoying a picnic lunch, continue your Yellowstone adventure with a scenic drive through Hayden Valley, one of the park's premier wildlife viewing areas. Keep your eyes peeled for bison grazing, elk wandering, and perhaps even bears or wolves in the distance, all set against sweeping open landscapes and the backdrop of the Yellowstone River.





Next, arrive at Yellowstone Lake, the park's largest body of water, known for its serene waters and striking mountain views. Take a leisurely stroll along the shoreline or simply pause to admire the lake's vast expanse, reflecting the surrounding peaks and sky.

Conclude the afternoon with a visit to Storm Point, a peaceful trail that winds along the lake and offers exceptional views of the water and distant cliffs. This gentle walk is perfect for stretching your legs, enjoying the fresh mountain air, and observing the lake's diverse flora and wildlife in a tranquil setting. This afternoon's experience combines breathtaking vistas, wildlife encounters, and relaxing lakeside scenery, providing a perfect balance of adventure and calm. DAY 4~WEDNESDAY~ SEPTEMBER 16

YELLOWSTONE NATIONAL PARK: LAMAR VALLEY/TOWER FALL/ MAMMOTH HOT SPRINGS

Begin your day with an early morning wildlife tour in Lamar Valley, often called Yellowstone's "Serengeti" for its abundant wildlife. As the sun rises, watch for herds of bison, elk, and pronghorn grazing across the valley floor, and keep an eye out for wolves or bears in their natural habitat - a truly unforgettable start to your day.



Next, visit Tower Fall, a striking 132-foot waterfall framed by rugged cliffs and pine forests. Take a short walk to the overlook and marvel at the powerful cascade and surrounding scenery.



After a full morning excursion seeking out glimpses of Yellowstone's iconic wildlife, we visit Mammoth Hot Springs. Here, you can explore the striking terraces formed by mineral deposits, a unique and ever-changing natural wonder.

In the early days, Yellowstone's visitors began their park explorations at Mammoth Hot Springs where the thermal waters, shimmering with a rainbow of colors, were believed to have curative powers. Now, the main attraction is the upper and lower terraces created by ongoing deposits of travertine (the Colosseum in Rome is largely made from travertine) in the form of white rocks, creating a constantly changing living sculpture where each photograph captures a new image time and again. Take some time to wander the boardwalks and soak in the beauty of this remarkable geothermal area. This full day combines incredible wildlife viewing, breathtaking waterfalls, iconic geothermal features, and the unforgettable spectacle of Old Faithful, showcasing the very best of Yellowstone's natural wonders.

DAY 5~THURSDAY ~ SEPTEMBER 17

GRAND TETON~ COLTER BAY/JENNY LAKE/NATIONAL MUSEUM OF WILDLIFE ART



This morning, depart Yellowstone and travel south to Jackson, Wyoming, the gateway to the dramatic landscapes of Grand Teton National Park. Begin your exploration with time on the Lakeshore Trail at Colter Bay, an easy, unguided walk along the edge of Jackson Lake with peaceful forest paths, sweeping alpine views, and frequent wildlife sightings. Pause midday to enjoy a picnic lunch in a scenic setting.

Continue to Jenny Lake, where a one-way ferry ride carries you across the water with unforgettable views of the Teton Range rising abruptly from the valley floor. Later, visit the National Museum of Wildlife Art, home to an outstanding collection dedicated to North American wildlife and the natural world.

Grand Teton National Park is defined by its iconic Teton Range – sharp, glaciated peaks dominated by the 13,770-foot Grand Teton – and a rich mix of habitats, from alpine meadows and sagebrush flats to lodgepole forests and mountain streams. This variety of environments supports exceptional wildlife viewing throughout the day.

Animals commonly seen include marmots, beavers, coyotes, chipmunks, and many kinds of birds. With luck, you may spot moose, elk, pronghorn, bison, or even one of the park's more elusive residents such as a bear or fox.

Birdwatchers will be delighted by the over 300 species recorded in the park, including 27 types of hawks. Key highlights by habitat include:

Lodgepole Pine Forests: Olive-sided Flycatcher, Yellow-rumped Warbler, Ruby-crowned Kinglet, Mountain and Black-capped Chickadee, Dark-eyed Junco, Tree and Violet-green Swallow, Saw-whet Owl, and various woodpeckers.



Schedules, accommodations and prices are accurate at the time of writing. They are subject to change.



Sagebrush Flats: Sage Grouse, Vesper and Brewer's Sparrow, and Sage Thrasher.

Alpine Areas: Golden Eagle, Clark's Nutcracker, Rosy Finch, White-crowned Sparrow, and Water Pipit.

Aquatic and Riparian Zones: Bald Eagle, Common Snipe, White-crowned and Lincoln Sparrow, Common Yellowthroat, American Dipper, and Trumpeter Swan.

The park also supports 16 fish species, including Yellowstone and Snake River cutthroat trout, mountain sucker, Utah chub, and mountain whitefish.

Today's journey gives you a well-rounded look at the landscapes and wildlife that define Grand Teton National Park.

Your accommodation for the next two nights, Elk Country Inn, is within walking distance of downtown Jackson Hole. The inn features 90 air-conditioned rooms equipped with safes, coffee/tea makers, and free Wi-Fi. Bathrooms include a shower/tub combination, complimentary toiletries, and a hairdryer. On-site amenities include an outdoor pool, fitness center, and laundry facilities.

DAY 6~FRIDAY~ SEPTEMBER 18
GRAND TETON~ SCHWABACHER LANDING/MORMON ROW/RAPTOR CENTER



Start your day exploring the scenic highlights of Grand Teton National Park. Begin at Schwabacher Landing, a serene riverside spot offering stunning reflections of the Teton peaks in the calm waters of the Snake River. This is an excellent location for photography and spotting wildlife such as moose, beavers, and a variety of waterfowl.

Next, visit Mormon Row, a historic area known for its iconic homesteads and rustic barns set against the dramatic Teton backdrop. This area provides a glimpse into the early settler history of the region and is a favorite for photographers and history enthusiasts alike.

Head into the Town of Jackson, Wyoming, a charming western town known for its wooden boardwalks, art galleries, and boutique shops. Enjoy some free time to wander the town at your own pace and have lunch on your own, soaking in the local atmosphere before continuing your journey.



Finally, stop by the Teton Raptor Center, a nonprofit organization dedicated to the care, rehabilitation, and conservation of birds of prey in the Greater Yellowstone region. The center focuses on educating visitors about the important role raptors play in the ecosystem while providing a safe home for injured or non-releasable birds. During your visit, you can see eagles, hawks, owls, and falcons up close and learn about their behavior, adaptations, and the conservation efforts that help protect these remarkable species. This stop offers a unique opportunity to connect with wildlife and gain a deeper understanding of the natural environment of Grand Teton National Park.

DAY 7~SATURDAY ~ SEPTEMBER 19

SALT LAKE CITY, UTAH

Today is mostly a travel day as you travel south from Jackson to Salt Lake City, enjoying a scenic drive through the Teton and Snake River valleys. The route passes rolling foothills, wide-open plains, and small towns, with the towering Tetons gradually receding in the distance. Along the way, keep an eye out for wildlife such as deer, elk, and pronghorn, and take in the changing landscapes as mountains give way to the broader Utah valleys.

En route visit the Stokes Nature Center which offers an engaging introduction to the natural landscapes and wildlife of northern Utah. Guided by knowledgeable naturalists, guests explore the area through hands-on activities and short walks that highlight local ecosystems, native plants, and animal life. The experience is both educational and interactive, making it an enjoyable way to learn about conservation, geology, and the seasonal changes that shape the region. Time at the center encourages curiosity and a deeper appreciation for Utah's outdoor environment in a relaxed, welcoming setting.



In Salt Lake City, explore the heart of the city with a visit to downtown, where you can enjoy the lively streets, historic buildings, and local shops. Stop at Temple Square, the city's iconic centerpiece, to admire the beautiful architecture and well-maintained gardens while learning about the history and culture of the area. DAY 8~SUNDAY~ SEPTEMBER 20

ZION NATIONAL PARK~ KOLOB CANYON

Depart Salt Lake City in the morning and begin your drive south toward Zion National Park, taking in the changing landscapes as mountains give way to desert valleys. Along the way, stop in Cedar City for lunch on your own and a chance to stretch your legs in this charming small town.

After lunch, continue toward Kolob Canyons, the northwestern section of Zion National Park known for its striking red sandstone cliffs and quieter, less-visited feel. A five-mile scenic drive winds into the canyon, revealing towering walls, deep finger canyons, and several pull-outs ideal for photos and short walks along the rim. From the viewpoint at the end of the road you'll find panoramic vistas across the canyon and Kolob Terrace. If you have time and energy, there are a few hiking options: a short Timber Creek Overlook trail to a classic lookout point, the Taylor Creek Trail that follows a creek through a narrow canyon to historic cabins and a double-arch alcove, or more ambitious routes such as the Kolob Arch trek for those seeking a longer wilderness experience. The area's unique geology and quieter trails make Kolob a rewarding introduction to the diverse landscapes of Zion before you continue your journey.



Red Cliffs Lodge is located 14 miles along scenic Highway 128 from downtown Moab, perched on the banks of the Colorado River. This iconic lodge, which has served as the backdrop for several famous films including Rio Grande with John Wayne, offers a perfect blend of relaxation and adventure. Guests can enjoy wine tastings at the on-site Castle Creek Winery, Utah's largest winery, which hosts daily tastings. Every room at Red Cliffs Lodge offers breathtaking views of the Colorado River or Castle Creek and is equipped with modern appliances, Wi-Fi, air conditioning, coffee/tea makers, and mini-fridges, ensuring a comfortable and convenient stay. On-site amenities include a seasonal outdoor pool, year-round hot tub, fitness center, horseback riding, lawn games, and picnic areas, making it easy to relax or enjoy outdoor activities after a day of exploring the stunning desert landscapes.

DAY 9~MONDAY~ SEPTEMBER 21

ZION NATIONAL PARK~ ZION CANYON TRAILS

Spend the day exploring the iconic Zion Canyon, home to towering red cliffs, narrow slot canyons, and lush riparian areas. Enjoy a selection of hiking trails, ranging from easy walks along the Riverside Walk to a more challenging route the West Rim Trail to Scout Lookout for breathtaking views of the canyon floor. The diversity of trails offers opportunities to see unique rock formations, waterfalls, and abundant wildlife, including mule deer and a variety of birds.





After your hikes, head into the nearby town of Springdale, located just outside the park entrance. This charming town offers local shops, art galleries, and cafes, providing a perfect place to relax, enjoy lunch or refreshments (*on your own*), and take in the stunning mountain scenery that surrounds the area. Your afternoon is at leisure.

DAY 10~TUESDAY~ SEPTEMBER 22

BRYCE CANYON

This morning travel to Bryce Canyon National Park, famous for its Claron Formation of hoodoos. The word hoodoo refers to slot canyons, windows, fins, and spires of rock created by erosion and rainwater. Minerals deposited within different types of rock cause hoodoos to have different colors throughout their height. At Bryce Canyon, hoodoos range in size from that of an average human to heights exceeding a 10-story building. Formed in sedimentary rock, their shapes are affected by erosional patterns. The alternating hard and softer rock layers are made of several rock types, including siltstone, mudstone, and predominantly limestone. Bryce Canyon is known as the archetype hoodoo terrain.



The canyons and plateau of Bryce Canyon National Park are home to many animals, and the park boundaries mean little to their migratory patterns. Hummingbirds, nesting Peregrine Falcon, Rocky Mountain elk and pronghorn cross daily through the forested plateau and barren amphitheater. The search for food and water leads them to the best place to find sustenance and shelter. Many animals share habitats, and the flow of populations is interdependent on all the members of the wildlife community. There are about 210 species of birds in Bryce Canyon and the surrounding area, including Wild Turkey, American White Pelican, and Great Blue Heron.

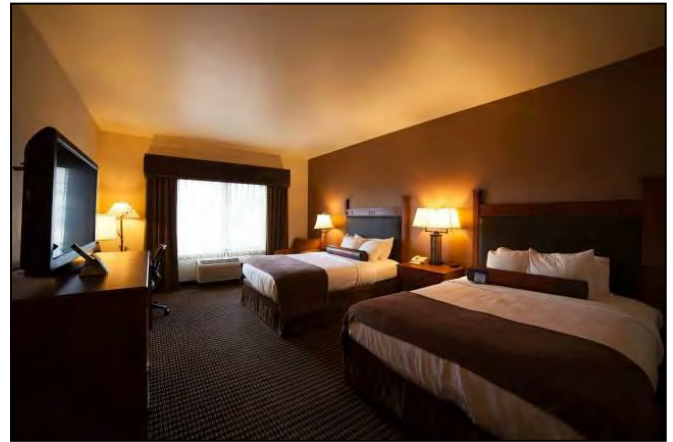


During your visit to Bryce Canyon National Park, explore the Queen's Garden Trail, one of the park's most popular and scenic hikes. This well-marked trail descends into the Bryce Amphitheater, winding among iconic hoodoos, delicate spires, and vibrant rock formations. Along the way, you'll pass through narrow corridors and natural arches, offering unique perspectives of the park's colorful landscape. The trail is considered accessible for most hikers and provides a rewarding experience with stunning views, making it an excellent introduction to the park's geological wonders.



This evening, visit Ebenezer's for dinner and lively cowboy entertainment. Rated the best place to eat in Bryce Canyon, your meal will include a live performance by the Bar G Wrangler's, Ebenezer's resident band.

DAY 11~WEDNESDAY~SEPTEMBER 23 MOAB, UTAH~ MESA ARCH

Depart Bryce Canyon in the morning and begin your drive east toward Moab, Utah, enjoying the striking desert landscapes along the way. Stop en route at the John Wesley Powell Museum to learn about the explorer's historic expeditions and the natural history of the region.

Continue to Canyonlands National Park, starting with Mesa Arch, a short and scenic hike to the iconic arch that frames expansive views of the surrounding canyons and mesas – a perfect spot for photos.

Next, visit Green River Overlook, where panoramic vistas of the Green River winding through the canyon offer a breathtaking perspective on this dramatic landscape.



After exploring these highlights, continue your journey to Moab, a lively gateway town offering dining, shops, and easy access to nearby national parks. This drive combines history, geology, and stunning scenery, making it a memorable day of travel through Utah's iconic red rock country.

DAY 12~THURSDAY~ SEPTEMBER 24

ARCHES NATIONAL PARK

Spend a full morning exploring the natural wonders of Arches National Park, home to more than 2,000 natural stone arches and a remarkable collection of sculpted fins, pinnacles, and balanced rocks shaped by wind and time. Begin with a visit to Delicate Arch, the park's most iconic landmark and a symbol of Utah itself. A moderate hike across slickrock and sandstone bowls rewards you with sweeping views and an unforgettable close-up of this graceful freestanding arch set against the vast desert landscape.



Continue to Sand Dune Arch, a quieter, tucked-away gem nestled between towering sandstone walls, where soft sand and filtered light create a surprisingly serene atmosphere. From there, explore the Devils Garden area to see Landscape Arch, one of the longest natural arches in the world, its improbably thin span stretching across the sky and offering exceptional photo opportunities along a scenic, well-maintained trail. Throughout the day, you'll encounter constantly changing colors, textures, and perspectives that reveal why Arches is one of the American Southwest's most awe-inspiring landscapes.



Take a break for lunch on your own at the nearby Food Truck Park in Moab, where a variety of local and casual dining options are available. Return for a relaxing afternoon in the premier setting of your accommodation, nestled along the majestic banks of the Colorado River.

This evening, relish the regional flavors over an included dinner as the sun departs the day beyond the cliffs.

DAY 13~ FRIDAY~ SEPTEMBER 25 MONUMENT VALLEY/PAGE, ARIZONA

On the road again this morning driving towards Monument Valley, not a traditional valley, but a broad, flat landscape punctuated by towering red sandstone buttes and spires that rise hundreds of feet above the desert floor. These striking formations are the remnants of ancient sedimentary rock layers that once covered the region. Formed over millions of years through erosion by wind and water, the valley showcases some of the most dramatic and unique landscapes on the Colorado Plateau. The rich red tones in the rocks and sand come from iron oxide, while dark streaks, known as desert varnish, are deposits of manganese oxide.



After a picnic lunch, embark on a 2 ½- hour Jeep Tour into Monument Valley with a local guide from Navajo Nation, the only way to enter the vast Monument Valley backcountry.

In addition to sandstone, the area bears traces of past volcanic activity, with Agathla Peak being one of the most notable features. The valley's sparse vegetation includes purple sage, which contrasts beautifully with the red rocks, while juniper bushes, cliffrose, rabbitbrush, and snakewood appear where moisture allows. Few trees grow in this arid environment, giving Monument Valley its iconic, open desert appearance.

Continue to Horseshoe Bend. Hike a gentle trail of loose desert sand and sandstone rocks that date back to the early Jurassic period. Over millions of years, wind and water have eroded these rocks to create weird, but awe-inspiring shapes and patterns. Upon reaching the overlook, you are awed by the extraordinary view of Horseshoe Bend as you see the emerald-green Colorado River make a horse-shoe-shaped bend before rushing towards the Grand Canyon. The overlook is 4,200 feet above sea level and the Colorado River is at 3,200 feet above sea level making it a breathtaking 1,000-foot drop. The magnificence of the landscape cannot be expressed in words or through a photograph!



Horseshoe Bend is arguably the best location to witness the sunset in Page, Arizona. The sun sets directly over Horseshoe Bend as you gaze westward from the overlook.

Antelope is the most visited slot canyon in the Southwest, partly because it is easily accessible and by far the most publicized; it is extremely beautiful, with just the right combination of depth, width, length, rock color and ambient light.





After your locally led tour to Antelope Canyon, the journey continues onward to Grand Canyon National Park, one of the world's most iconic natural landmarks. As you travel, the scenery transitions from wide-open desert vistas to landscapes dotted with pinyon and juniper forests. You will stop by the Cameron Trading Post for lunch before continuing into the park.

Upon arrival, begin your exploration at Desert View, where the historic Watchtower offers sweeping panoramas of the canyon and the Colorado River far below.

In the afternoon, visit Mather Point, one of the park's most dramatic overlooks, known for its wide, layered vistas and excellent photography angles. Continue to Yavapai Point, where expansive views and the geology museum help bring the canyon's ancient story to life. Remain here through sunset as the shifting light brings out deep reds, golds, and purples across the rock walls – an unforgettable way to end your Grand Canyon experience.

DEPOSIT AND FINAL PAYMENT: You will be required to pay the following per person deposits when booking. Those amounts are:

All deposits are subject to the Cancellation policy herein. Final payment is required no less than 95 days prior to departure (June 10, 2026) unless otherwise stated. Some fares or services must be paid in full at the time of booking. Payments may be made by check or with a credit card (American Express, Visa, MasterCard, or Discover.) 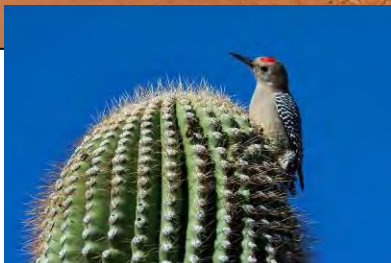
