DAY 1~THURSDAY~DECEMBER 26

USA/EN ROUTE

The excitement of your odyssey begins as you board your overnight flight to Cairo. (Meals Aloft)

DAY 2~FRIDAY~ DECEMBER 27 CAIRO, EGYPT

Upon your arrival in Cairo this morning, you will be met by your Classic Escapes representative, who will assist you through Customs and escort you to your hotel. As the heart of both ancient and modern Egypt, Cairo demonstrates the dichotomy of all things Egyptian as the medieval and the contemporary Western Worlds come together in a confusion of earthen houses and towering modern office buildings of flashy cars and donkey-drawn carts.




For the next two nights, you will

enjoy first-class accommodation on the western bank of the Nile with breathtaking views to enchant you and ancient zoological and botanical gardens just outside your door. The balance of your day is at leisure, which allows time for you to acclimate to your new surroundings.

Tonight's welcome dinner will offer you an introduction to Egyptian cuisine, and a chance to get acquainted with your fellow travelers.

The Marriott Mena House Hotel is set in beautiful jasmine-scented gardens with the great pyramids towering behind. It was originally built as a royal lodge used by Khedive Ismail, the King of Egypt, as a house for himself and his guests while on hunting trips in the desert or during visits to the Pyramids of Giza. With the opening of the Suez Canal, he enlarged the guesthouse to receive international and royal guests visiting the Pyramids. It was a hotel as early as 1880. In recent years the hotel has been meticulously renovated and expanded. Public areas are decorated in an ornate Arabesque style. Comfortable guest rooms offer modern amenities including airconditioning, flat screen TV, in-room safe, coffee/tea making facilities, minibar, hair dryer, internet access, and 24-hour in-room dining. There is a selection of indoor and outdoor dining venues offering a variety of international cuisines. The hotel has a spa, fitness center, and outdoor swimming pool. DAY 3~SATURDAY~ DECEMBER 28 CAIRO~ PYRAMIDS, SPHINX, SAKKARA & DAHSHUR

After breakfast, journey to the Sphinx and the Pyramids at Giza, built over 4,500 years ago. The Sphinx of Giza is a symbol that has represented the essence of Egypt for thousands of years. The body of a lion with the head of a king or god, the Sphinx has come to symbolize strength and wisdom. From the north side, the profile of the Sphinx appears as though the head is small in proportion to the body. Because of the changing desert terrain, the body of the Sphinx has been buried many times over the past several thousand years. Most recently in 1905, the sand has been cleared away to expose the magnitude and beauty of the entirety of the Sphinx. The paws themselves are 50 feet long while the entire length is 150 feet. Although the head of the Sphinx is battered in places, traces of the original paint can still be seen near one ear, leading archeologists to believe that originally the Sphinx was colorfully painted.




It is impossible to give proper attention here to the complexity of Egypt's many gifts - especially the infamous pyramids. Despite the great archeological discoveries in Egypt, recent indicators are that only 30% of its antiquities have been unearthed, leaving 70% still buried beneath the sands. While the pyramids of Giza seem to be funerary in nature, to regard them as merely tombs is an oversimplification. Each tomb is actually a complex of buildings, as it was the dead pharaoh's palace of the afterlife, where he was mystically transformed and resurrected as a full god.

Located behind the Sphinx is the largest and oldest of Giza's pyramids - Cheops. This pyramid is thought to have been built between 2589 - 2566 BC. It would have taken over 2,300,000 blocks of stone with an average weight of 2.5 tons each. The total weight

society and very wealthy. He was buried alone in this massive tomb. His wives may have been buried nearby in smaller

mastabas. (Entrance fee to the pyramid is not included and is at an additional cost of \$20 per person.)

Lunch will be taken at the 09 Pyramids Lounge Restaurant with spectacular views of the pyramids. Afterward, continue to the necropolis of Sakkara where fourteen pyramids were built, including one of the world's oldest stone structures, the step pyramid of Zoser. Spread over seven kilometers of desert, Sakkara is one of the most important archaeological sites in the world.






Continue to the rarely visited pyramids at Dahshur, including the strange "bent" pyramid of Snefru, the angle of whose walls alter halfway up, and the "red" pyramid, over twice as wide as it is high. Be aware there will be extensive crouching and climbing when entering tombs. People who feel uncomfortable with tight spaces should not enter the tombs. Overnight at the MARRIOTT MENA HOUSE HOTEL. DAY 4~SUNDAY~ DECEMBER 29

CAIRO~ GRAND EGYPTIAN MUSEUM/CITADEL/COPTIC CAIRO & KHAN EL KHALILI BAZAAR

You will have a full day of exploration with your guide today. Spend the morning exploring the Grand Egyptian Museum, the largest archaeological museum complex in the world and host to more than 100,000 artifacts. For the first time ever, King Tut's entire treasure collection of 5,000 items will be on display. The exhibition galleries, storage center, and conference center with 3D cinema, along with retail outlets, restaurants, and ancillary buildings: the new home of the royal mummies and other treasures of ancient Egypt is vast. So as not to disfigure the Giza Plateau, it has been built a small distance away, downhill from the Pyramids of Khufu, Khafre, and Menkaure. If its size and the complexity of its design match those of the pyramids, so too did the challenges associate with its construction.



Next continue to Old Cairo and the Citadel, situated on a highly visible spur of the Mokattam Hills of Old Cairo, which was the nerve center of Egypt for almost 700 years. Construction of the grand structure began in 1176 and was completed by Muhammad Ali Pasha, ruler of Egypt in the late 19th century. Mamluk sultans and Turkish governors resided in the Citadel,

which is among the world's most splendid monuments of medieval warfare.

Facing the Citadel is the Mosque of Sultan Hassan, built between 1356 and 1363 and perhaps the most majestic monument of Arab architecture in Egypt, and the Mosque of Al-Rifai which was constructed in two phases between 1869 and 1912 when it was finally completed. Although you will not go inside the mosques, you will see them on the outside and marvel at their grandeur.

Lunch will be at Naguib Mahfouz restaurant, in the middle of Khan El Khalili Bazaar in the Islamic district of the city, known for its narrow alleys and hundreds of shops selling all types of Egyptian handicrafts, silver and gold jewelry, cotton textiles, copperware, and perfumes. It is said to be the oldest open-air market in the Middle East.



Then, visit Coptic Cairo, and the 4th Century Suspended Church of the Virgin Mary; see Ben Ezra, Egypt's oldest synagogue purported site of Moses' rescue from the bulls. Overnight at the MARRIOTT MENA HOUSE HOTEL. (B,L)





Day 5~ Monday~ December 30

CAIRO/LUXOR~ CRUISE EMBARKATION/ KARNAK & LUXOR TEMPLE


Fly this morning to Luxor to begin your remarkable journey down the Nile River aboard your luxury cruise ship Sonesta Moon Goddess. In Luxor, check into your spacious vessel, after 11:00 am, and enjoy lunch on board.

Please note, luggage restrictions apply to this regional flight.

a. Maximum of one checked bag, weighing up to 50 lbs – Economy, 70 lbs – Business. Checked baggage cannot be larger than 62 linear inches.

b. Guests can also bring a piece of carry-on luggage with a maximum weight of 17 lbs. Passengers flying in Business Class may bring two pieces of carry-on luggage.

This afternoon's exploration begins with a tour of the extraordinary Karnak Temple, a complex of obelisks, pylons, courts, colonnades, halls, reliefs, and sanctuaries once connected to Luxor Temple by a two-mile path lined with sphinxes. It is the second largest religious structure in the world, a 60-acre archeological treasure built by generation after generation of pharaohs. The most important temple area is dedicated to Amon-Ra and was in use for over 2,000 years, longer than any other religious building in history. The sheer magnitude of this colossal structure is nearly beyond comprehension.



Continue to Luxor Temple,

standing in the center of the city. Many festivals were celebrated in ancient times and the Temple of Luxor was the center of the most important one, the festival of Opet. Built largely by Amenhotep III and Ramesses II, it appears that the temple's purpose was a suitable setting for the rituals of the festival.

Return to your Nile cruise boat for the night. Enjoy a delicious dinner on board the cruise ship, followed by live music and a unique belly dance show.

The best way to explore the mystery of the Nile is by sailing along the magnificent river, enjoying the glamorous sun by daytime, hugging the full moon with your

eyes at night, and spending the time of your life on board the Sonesta Moon Goddess. The Ship offers 49 luxurious cabins with sliding glass doors opening to private balconies and 4 presidential suites with a private lounge. All accommodations feature their own private balcony. Your spacious cabin features panoramic views, either one queen or two twin beds, a private direct dial telephone, a hairdryer, a safe, minibar, a music system, individual climate control, television, and movie programs. DAY 6~TUESDAY~DECEMBER 31 West Bank/Valley Of Kings & Queens

Your excursion this morning will be to Luxor's West Bank to explore the ancient city of Thebes. Stand in awe at the necropolis of pharaohs and nobility as you are greeted by the Colossi of Memnon: two giant seated statues of Amenophis III. Tour the Valley of the Kings, where you are surrounded by the eternal tombs of the pharaohs from the 18th and 19th dynasties of the New Kingdom. From 1903-1906 an Italian expedition discovered approximately 80 tombs, some of which belonged to children of royalty. Many were severely damaged by fire or converted to stables for donkeys and camels.





Continue to the Valley of the Queens and the mortuary temple of Queen Hatshepsut sheltered by the surrounding cliffs. The ancient Egyptians gave it the name Set Neferu, meaning "seat of beauty."

You will visit three very different tombs of the many in the area. Within them, you'll see ancient paintings and carvings in colors that retain much of their original freshness illustrating the life of the owner and his passage to the afterlife. Here you will also see and learn about the work of Dr. Kent Weeks and his study of KV 5. (KV is an abbreviation for the Valley of the Kings, followed by a number to designate individual tombs in the Valley.) His work has unearthed great progress in the exploration of this particular tomb. There seems to be yet another level of chambers in KV 5 which brings the chamber count to over 120 and the newly discovered corridor will add significantly to that number.

Visit the tomb of Tutankhamun, also known by its tomb number, KV62, the burial place of Tutankhamun, widely known as the "Boy King," as his reign began and ended in childhood. He was the Pharaoh of Egypt from age 9 until his death at age 18.





Day 7~Wednesday~ January 1, 2025 Edfu/ Kom Ombo

This morning visit Edfu, one of the best-preserved temples in Egypt, the Horus Temple, which honors the falcon-headed god. Ptolemy II began construction of the temple in 237 BC., but it was not completed until 57 B.C. Without question, this 118-foot-high 262-foot-wide temple is one of the most splendid examples of late temple architecture. The incredible number of inscriptions on its walls has greatly enriched our knowledge of Egyptian civilization, especially in the area of theology and cult practices.

Return to the ship for lunch and sail towards Kom Ombo to visit a unique thirdcentury temple with beautiful stone reliefs, murals, and a dramatic view of the Nile. Kom Ombo is home to an unusual double temple built during the Ptolemaic and Roman periods. The temple is dedicated to the crocodile god Sobek and the falcon god Haroeris (*Horus the Elder*).





Reboard your cruise ship to enjoy dinner and entertainment while sailing overnight toward Aswan. Tonight, enjoy an Egyptian Galabeya (traditional Egyptian gown) Party. Overnight aboard the M/S SONESTA MOON GODDESS. (B,L,D)

DAY 8~THURSDAY~JANUARY 2 Aswan

Your tour takes you to one of Egypt's modern wonders – the Aswan High Dam – completed in 1971 and located just south of Aswan. It was constructed not only to regulate the yearly flood of the Nile but also to create a water reservoir capable of storing water to prevent famine during severe droughts. The reservoir is

known as Lake Nasser, named after Egyptian President Gamal Abdel Nasser, who undertook the construction of this national project in 1960. During the course of construction, provisions were made to repatriate the Nubian inhabitants, and, in a multi-national effort, to relocate the Great Temple of Abu Simbel. Also, visit Aswan's Granite Quarries and Unfinished Obelisk.

Next, you will be taken by a small boat to the island of Agilkia. Visit the complex at Philae where its main temple, dating from the third century B.C., is dedicated to the goddess Isis when the area was the last bastion of ancient Egyptian religion and hieroglyphic usage. It is also a superb example of threatened cultural heritage being saved in the face of modern civilization's march to change the environment. Like Abu Simbel, the Temple was moved in its entirety when the High Dam was built and Agilkia became its new home.

Continue sailing on the Nile by motorboat to the Nubian Village on Soheil Island which is located on the West Bank of the River Nile in Aswan and near the Aswan Dam passing by the First Cataract of Aswan. Nubians are an Ethnic group who live in the south of Egypt (*Aswan*) and the north of Sudan. The Nubian villages are located on the East and on the West banks of the river Nile or as islands. Old villages used to be where Lake Nasser is now, and they were relocated in 1964 as a result of building the High Dam of Aswan.

As you sail, watch the Sahara and sand dunes of the Western desert, the flowing water over the granite stone (the first cataract), flora, and fauna of the area, as well as birds, especially migrants such as herons, egrets, and kingfishers. You will also have a chance



to see very important sites such as the Agha Khan Mausoleum and the ruins of the Elephantine Island.

Upon arrival, fully immerse yourself in their simple lifestyle, culture, and traditions. Walk through the village and see its traditional colorful houses built from mud brick, visit a family, and have a Nubian drink (*mint tea or hibiscus tea*), partake in a henna session, plate your hair into braids, and have lunch inside one of the Nubian houses with Egyptian/Nubian specialties like tajin and mahshi that have been prepared just for you.

Return to your lovely vessel for one last overnight. Overnight aboard the M/S SONESTA MOON GODDESS. (B,L,D)

Day 9~Friday~January 3 Aswan~ Disembarkation/Cairo

Disembark Sonesta Moon Goddess cruise in Aswan this morning where you transfer to the airport to board your flight back to Cairo.

<u>Optional Tour to Abu Sibel at an additional cost (\$475 per person, currently & subject to change)</u> Fly to Abu Simbel via Aswan and visit the Abu Simbel Temple.

As you approach the site on foot, you'll discover the massive temples dedicated to Ramses II and his legendary wife Nefertari. These architectural wonders are two of the most tremendous monuments constructed in the ancient world, over 100 feet high and guarded by colossal stone figures of Ramses II. The entire monument was cut into 2,000 pieces and moved to its present site when the Aswan High Dam was constructed, a feat almost as amazing as its original construction. The temple was so perfectly reconstructed that on only two days a year, the sun shines from the entrance all the way into the sanctuary, 112 feet away.

In the afternoon fly back to Aswan and board your flight to Cairo.



This evening, you will be treated to dinner with your fellow travelers as a farewell to Egypt.



This morning, depart Cairo and bid farewell to Egypt arriving back home eager to share memories and photos with your family and friends. (B, Meals Aloft)





DAY 1~SUNDAY~ DECEMBER 22 USA/AMMAN

Begin your journey with an overnight flight to Amman. (Meals Aloft)

DAY 2~MONDAY~ DECEMBER 23 Amman/Dead Sea

Arrive Amman, where you will be met by your specialist guide and drive to the Dead Sea, the lowest point on earth, lying some 1,300 feet below sea level. Float in the salty waters of this historical site and enjoy the wonderful facilities of your hotel and world-class spa.

Time permitting, you may want to take a trip to the tip of the Dead Sea to Lot's Cave, an ancient cave believed to be used as a sanctuary by Lot and his daughters after the destruction of Sodom. The site, marked on the Madaba



map of Palestine, was just recently discovered. Artifacts from 3000 BC have been found here. This is a hot and arid place filled with extraordinary geological formations.

The remainder of your day is at leisure to relax, enjoy the facilities of your hotel, and get ready for your upcoming adventure.

DAY 3~TUESDAY~DECEMBER 24 Amman/Jerash

Drive to Jerash, one of the most complete surviving examples of a provincial Roman city built on a site that has been



occupied since the Neolithic Age. Jerash, part of the Decapolis, has been called the "Pompeii of the East" due to its superb state of preservation. Drift back 6500 years as you walk along colonnaded streets to see baths, plazas, and arches in pristine condition. See the temples of Zeus and Artemis in addition to a Nymphaeum.

Proceed to the still formidable fortress of Ajlun built by Saladin's nephew Izz al-Din Usama to contain the advances of the Latin Kingdom of Transjordan, a crusader state. Enjoy lunch in the area and return to your hotel in the afternoon where your evening is at leisure.

DAY 4~WEDNESDAY~ DECEMBER 25

DEAD SEA/MT. NEBO/PETRA


Depart today for the beautiful old city of Petra, one of the seven wonders of the modern world and a member of the UNESCO heritage. En route, you'll visit Mt. Nebo, the traditional burial site of Moses with views of the Jordan Valley and the Dead Sea. Here Franciscans have built a structure that protects a 4th - and 6th - century Byzantine church. Through the scenic canyons of Wadi Mujib reach the castle at Kerak, built by King Fulk of Jerusalem in 1142 to secure the largely amorphous region of the Transjordan against Saracen attacks. Arrive in Petra in the late afternoon and your home for the next two nights.

Your luxurious home for the next two nights is located at the entrance to the Petra archaeological site and has 183 rooms. Boasting authentic antiques, artwork, and fine gold inlay, it is one of the most notable hotels in the Middle East and a recipient of the Aga Khan Award for outstanding Islamic architecture.

Day 5~Thursday~ December 26 Petra




Depart for a full day tour of Petra, the soul stirring, rose-red city and Jordanian national treasure, designated as a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Petra was an ancient Nabataean capital settled by industrious Arab traders more than 2,000 years ago. Petra's unique location enabled the Nabataeans to dominate the ancient Arabian trade routes, and the city became wealthy from the tolls it levied on the caravans that sheltered there with their precious cargoes of spices, silks, ivory, and animal hides. In the ancient world, Petra was renowned for its refined culture, massive architecture, and ingenuous system of dams and water channels. In the years following Emperor Trajan's annexation of Petra, the city declined and slipped into obscurity until it was "discovered" in 1812 by a Swiss traveler. Excavations that revealed the

astounding workmanship and the incredible ruins at Petra did not begin until 1924. Ongoing excavations continue to reveal more information about the Nabataean Kingdom.

Petra still forms part of the domain of the Bedouin. You will see them with their horses and camels as you begin your unforgettable trip to this cultural



landmark. After passing tombs outside the city, you come to the "Siq," an immense crack in the Nubian sandstone almost one-half mile long. This winding fissure separates overhanging cliffs that appear to meet 300 feet overhead. Near the end of the passage, the Siq makes one last turn and out of the gloom Petra's most impressive monument Al Khazneh (The Treasury) appears in the sunlight. One of the most elegant remains of antiquity, Al Khazneh is nearly 140 feet high and was carved from the



mountain's solid rock in the First Century B.C. Originally used as a Nabataean king's tomb, Al Khazneh was later used as a Nabataean temple. Film buffs will recognize it from its starring role in the final scenes of the movie *Indiana Jones and the Temple of Doom*.



Beyond Al Khazneh you are surrounded by hundreds of Petra's sculpted structures, soaring temples, elaborate royal tombs, a Roman amphitheater (seating 3,000) large and small houses, burial chambers, banquet halls, water channels and reservoirs, baths, monumental staircases, cultic installations, markets, arched gates, public buildings, and paved streets – it's quite overwhelming. This afternoon, return to your hotel in Petra.

Dinner at Petra Kitchen is a delightful way to round up your Jordan travel experiences. Like any home kitchen, the Petra Kitchen is a relaxed, informal atmosphere where you'll gather to prepare an evening meal, working alongside local women under the supervision of an experienced chef. Each evening meal includes soup, cold and hot Mezza, salads, and a main course – all typical Jordanian dishes. You will get an inside glimpse of the secrets behind the famous regional cuisine of the Levant. Petra Kitchen offers an evening of learning, fun, and a very special dining experience, with each dish gaining the special flavor of a reward well-earned. Great care has been taken to make Petra Kitchen a truly Jordanian experience – right down to the furnishings, all crafted in Jordan, the tableware, all produced by the Iraq al-Amir



Women's Co-operative, and the aprons and table linen, all hand-embroidered by the Jordan River Foundation. Overnight at the PETRA MOVENPICK HOTEL. (B,L,D)



DEPOSIT AND FINAL PAYMENT: You will be required to pay the following per-person deposits when booking. Those amounts are:

All deposits are subject to the Cancellation policy herein. Final payment is required no less than 95 days prior to departure (September 22, 2024) unless otherwise stated.
